The event will start at 10:00 AM and will provide participants the opportunity to go to the gun club and go through the stations shooting at 50 sporting clays. The cost for the event is based on what equipment you bring. If you provide your own gun, ammunition, ear protection and eye protection (all required to have), the cost will be \$40 plus tax. If you need to purchase/rent any of the mentioned items, the price will increase accordingly and could make the total cost be \$75 if you needed the gun club to provide everything. All interested in registering for the shoot are asked to submit the registration form along with a \$25 deposit. Since total costs are dependent on individual needs, you should be prepared to make further payment at the gun club. Reminder to Pay your Dues to the Alumni Association

Since the Alumni Association does not send out notices telling its members to pay their dues at a specific time, the best thing to do to keep up with dues payments is to make your payment every two years in conjunction with the CMAAA Reunion. CMA Alumnus Honored



South Oak Street in Hohenwald, Tennessee was dedicated as CPL PRENTICE J. BENNETT USMC MEMORIAL DRIVE on Saturday, January 27th. Jim Borum, '66, and Winston Elston, '74, were in attendance with about thirty other friends and family members as Prentice's cousin, Pattie Lankford Davis, unveiled the new street sign. Attendees included six members of Rolling Thunder, an organization dedicated to POW-MIA awareness and veteran welfare. Prentice attended CMA for three years, graduating with the Class of 1965. He was the Band Company Commander his senior year. After graduation in 1965 he entered the US Marine Corps and was assigned to the 6th Fleet in the Mediterranean prior to his assignment to B Company, 1st Battalion, 9th Regiment, 3rd Marine Division. He lost his life in Vietnam in 1968. He was inducted into the CMAAA Hall of Honor in 2008.



CMA Memories

When I was in the 8th and 9th grades at CMA I attended the Maury County Fair with many other Cadets. Also, like many Cadets, I was attracted to the burlesque or strip shows that were a popular attraction at carnivals of the period. They were very entertaining and enlightening and one thing that I can write of today was the shell game that preceded the show. Picture this: a group of men, boys and Cadets milling around waiting for the show to begin and in walks a fast talking man with a collapsible table and an offer to bet anyone that he could hide a pea under one of three cups or shells and move the cups around so that you could not guess which one the pea was under. He demonstrates

and its not too hard to see where the pea is hidden. We little Cadets would crowd around to start the game betting dimes and quarters and we could win a fast couple of bucks, maybe enough to pay for the show. As we little boys played and won, older men would begin to pay attention and even placed a bet or two. As the pace of the game quickened the men would pull out their wallets and we boys were smart enough to know that it was time to go. The men who continued to play as the stakes got higher were about to get their clocks cleaned. We boys learned a lot in the peep show tent. Among other things that we learned: It's hard to win playing the other man's game.

Behind South Johnson barracks on the CMA campus was a long steep hill that was great for sledding on the rare occasion of appreciable snow. The only hindrance was the little branch, enclosed by rock walls, that flowed at the bottom of the hill. We had no sleds, but there were old metal lockers stored in the basement under Johnson Hall. The metal doors, when removed, made great sleds. They were smooth on the bottom, about 18 inches wide and 6 feet long. Of course, it could not be steered and that added to the fun. All we wanted was to go downhill as fast as possible. You really did need to put out your feet and stop the sled before reaching the branch at the bottom, however. I can still see through my mind's eye as Kenny Beall and another boy came sliding down that hill on a cold winter's afternoon. They waited just a fraction too long before trying to stop and the locker door/sled went sideways with them. It teetered on the edge of the wall above the branch for a second or two before dumping them into the water. Everyone on the hill cheered.

We were seated in Colonel Ragsdale's office which was located to the right of the front door entrance of what is now Ragsdale Hall and was then known as "The Office". I was feeling pretty small and not at all sure I wanted to leave home and come all the way to Columbia to board and attend military school.

An attractive young lady entered the room with paperwork for Colonel Martin. She said, "Hello Mr. Heneger, I haven't seen you in years." Daddy stood up and said, "Why it's the little Beckham girl" and hugged her. Mariemma Beckham Grimes is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Charles Beckham. When Dad moved to Marshall County, Mr. Beckham was one of his first friends. Dairy farmers on Mooresville Pike, Mr. and Mrs. Beckham would have Dad out to their house for Sunday dinner. Daddy met Mrs. Grimes when she was a little girl. That broke the ice at CMA for me.

I knew during five years at CMA that I had a friend there anytime I needed her. She was good to me and my brother, Joe, and we were pleased to attend an on-campus ceremony in the summer of 1997 when the Mariemma Beckham Grimes Building was dedicated in her honor. She was a friend to me and my family and to many CMA cadets over many years.
