Mixed with the civilian clad veterans of previous years were the uniformed raw recruits who, in future years, would form the material for the officers and non-commissioned officers of the battalion.


At the conclusion of a three week tryout period, Cadet Major Daryle Dixson, after five years in the academy, emerged as the commanding officer of the battalion.

Almost as soon as uniforms were issued, military classwork began on a schedule of three days a week for the senior division and two days a week for the junior group. This schedule, affording one hundred and sixty-five hours of instruction, was far superior to the Department of the Army's requirement of ninety hours.


During the year, Major Algood, Professor of Military Science and Tactics, instructed classes in military organization and map reading, while Captain Lynn held classes on rifle squad tactics and combat formation. Master Sergeant Gilbert taught rifle marksmanship, and Sergeant First Class Bakeman assembled and taught descriptions and characteristics of all types of weapons on the campus. Sergeant Burrill taught first aid and hygiene and served as administrative clerk. Sergeant Rollins served as an assistant instructor.

As classes progressed, precision on the drill field kept pace. Officers and non-commissioned officers perfected their respective units for monthly efficiency company awards, one of which was won by Company A, two by Company C, one by Company D, and one by Band Company.

Since the opening day of school, one event had been foremost in the minds of the cadets—Government Inspec-

tion. After many months of preparation, April 13, Government Inspection Day, arrived. For two weeks previous to that date, every effort had been directed toward continuing the rating of Honor School. When the inspecting officers entered the gate, the battalion was ready. The morning program for the first day included a barracks inspection, a formal dress parade, and an inspection formation on the field. After second mess, the inspectors reviewed the various units as they went through precision close order drill. After the drill period, the inspectors complimented the cadets' knowledge and precision and selected Company B as the best drilled company during the inspection. Tuesday afternoon the inspecting officers consulted with the Military Department and examined the military facilities, thus completing another annual Government Inspection.

With Government Inspection behind, and only six weeks remaining in the school year, most of the drill periods were spent in preparing for Commencement field festivities. Each cadet pressed forward with pride and hope, looking ahead to that blistering hot day in June when he would take his place on the field for the final parade, and with the notes of "Silver Taps" ringing in his ears, be able to say, "I was part of the best battalion yet."

The year 1952-53 was enjoyed by the band as one of its most successful seasons.



In 1944 Coach Prickett took over "B" team football and basketball. Now he is serving as tennis coach.




Other outstanding players on the 1952-53 squad were Joe Guess, Tommy Dorsey, Kenneth Tate, and Kenneth Taylor.






TRACK
