























TO A MAN WE ADMIRE . . .


CALL, entirely free from campus politics.

Columbia Military Academy experienced its twenty-first consecutive year as an honor school designated by the United States Government.






GOLD STAR DRILL PLATOON

C.M.A. 19; DARLINGTON 6



Camden's line averaged 10 pounds heavier per man than ours and their backs were well experienced in the knack of breaking away for long gains.


Camden scored early in the first quarter on an option play and was never seriously threatened. The Bulldogs showed fierce determination but were unable to stem the offensive strength of their opponents.

David Farmer, John Raksnis, Farrell Skillern, and Jimmy Mays were the defensive standouts.


C.M.A. 46; G.M.A. 6

C.M.A. 13; CASTLE HEIGHTS 0


The CMA "Bulldogs" defeated the Castle Heights Military Academy "Tigers" in Castle Heights' Homecoming game 13 to 0.


C.M.A. 28; SEWANEE "B" 0




It was the expert coaching of Captain Gunn




This is the fifth year at CMA for wrestling as a varsity sport. Much interest has been shown this year, and the team has shown great improvement over the past years.

The prospects for next year are very good since many lettermen will be back.




