
I feel qualified to write about bullring, in that experience is a good teacher; therefore, I should be very learned.

The Military Department at CMA is responsible for introducing the Cadet Corps to Junior ROTC. This is accomplished through the classes in military training which meet four days a week, and through drill.

Major Richard A. Walterhouse, the Senior Army Instructor, teaches the following MT subjects: Tactics, Leadership, and Marksmanship. Sergeant First Class Donald F. Sorrell teaches Small Unit Tactics, Map Reading, and Marksmanship. Master Sergeant Robert F. Allen teaches Introduction to ROTC, Courtesies and Customs, Military Teaching Methods, Communications, Weapons, and Methods of Instruction. Sergeant Major Alphonse J. Lambert teaches Tactics, First Aid, Weapons, Map Reading, and Military History.

The team matched skills with ROTC and National Rifle Association teams in the surrounding area.


The highlight of the season was capturing first place in the Tennessee Trophy Match, in which all of the military academies of Tennessee participated.





#### Academic Excellence

The administration and faculty of CMA believe that students who excell academically should be recognized for their achievement. To achieve this goal, the school honors scholastically superior students by rating them in three groups: Cum Laude, Scholarship, and Honor Roll.

Cum Laude is the highest scholastic rating a CMA student may receive. Based on a four-point quality system, with an additional point for honors courses, a student with a minimum of a 3.75 quality point average qualifies for a Cum Laude rating.

A student with an average of 3.00 or above qualifies for a Scholarship rating, and a student with a 2.50 average or above is eligible for Honor Roll Rating.




### Homecoming 1970

Although the alumni attendance was not what it could have been, the 1970 Homecoming was a great success, and thoroughly enjoyed by everyone who attended.













