



A CADEMIC

VALEDICTORIAN

Lee Gordon Denton of Gatlinburg, Tennessee, has won the highest academic award conferred by Columbia Military Academy. With a grade average of 94.72, Lee is Valedictorian of the Senior Class of 1962. Having attended C.M.A. for four years, he has established an extraordinary scholastic record. During his Freshman and Sophomore years Lee was second in class standing. As a Junior, he won the Junior Class Medal and the Chemistry Medal. Lee's military grades have been high, thus placing him in the top ten per cent of his military class each year. But his activities are not limited solely to study. For three years Lee has been a member of the Gold Star Drill Platoon, acting as Assistant Drill Master this year. For his qualities as a leader, he has received the Association of the United States Army Medal for the Outstanding M.S.T. III Junior and the Third Army Ribbon as the outstanding cadet in M.S.T. III. In addition, Lee has qualified as an expert marksman. A member of the National Honor Society, Lee serves as President of the C.M.A. chapter. He has served as Secretary and Vice-President of the Y.M.C.A. and has received the Good Conduct Ribbon one year. Lee is assigned to the Staff as Battle Group Executive Officer and holds the rank of Lieutenant Colonel. He was elected to the Hall of Fame and the Senior Class gave him the Superlative "Most Likely to Succeed." Planning to study chemical engineering, Lee will enter the University of Tennessee next fall.



SALUTATORIAN

The Academic Department has awarded Leverett Lynn Guess of Columbia, Tennessee, the second highest scholastic honor: Salutatorian of the Class of 1962. Earning the honor of Salutatorian is a continuation of his underclass years during which Lynn earned the class medals in his Freshman and Sophomore years, the science medals in general science and biology, and was second in the Junior Class standing. By being in the top ten per cent of his M.S.T. classes, Lynn has received the military wreath for academic achievement for four years. Active in many fields, he has been on the Gold Star Drill Platoon for three years. He has worked on the Dance Committee for three years, serving this year as Chairman of the Committee, and has been on the RECALL Staff two years, his Junior year as Class Editor and this year as Editor-in-Chief. During his Freshman year, Lynn was chosen the "Superior Cadet" in Military Science I, and he has received the Good Conduct Ribbon for two years. Leading the Cadet Corps as Battle Group Commander, Lynn was the first local cadet appointed to this position in the history of the school, a testimony to his outstanding abilities as a leader. In addition, he was the second cadet to receive the rank of Colonel, further evidence of his exemplary service. A member of the National Honor Society, Lynn has exhibited the finest qualities of scholarship, service, leadership, and character. Elected to the Hall of Fame, Lynn was also elected "Mr. C.M.A." by the Senior Class. Lynn will enter the University of Tennessee in the fall to study medicine.

SCHOLARSHIP BADGE

Maintaining a scholastic grade average of 86 or better in each subject is not an easy job and requires constant study and effort. Because of the difficulty of the task, only five per cent of the students at C.M.A. are able to boast of having accomplished this feat. But to the few who reach that goal during any one semester, the Academic Department awards a Scholarship Badge, a handsome red "S" embroidered on a black oval. Also, if a student has a final grade average of 86 or better in each subject, he is awarded a Scholarship Pin during the Commencement Exercises. The Scholarship Badge and the Scholarship Pin represent the highest distinction a cadet can earn scholastically.

Pictured above are the cadets who, for the first semester, were presented with the Scholarship Badge in recognition of their academic proficiency.


HONOR ROLL

To qualify for membership in the Honor Roll group a cadet must have an average of 80 or better in every subject. MILITARY STAFF

The mission of the Reserve Officers Training Corps at Columbia Military Academy is to introduce the students to basic military subjects, to inculcate habits of orderliness and precision, to instill discipline and thereby respect for constituted authority, to develop patriotism, to encourage a high standard of personal honor and deportment, and to prepare the student for participation in Advanced Military Training.


In carrying out this mission, the Military Staff of Columbia Military Academy has been most effective. Under the leadership of the Professor of Military Science, Major Crowley, until February when he was transferred to Viet Nam, the Military Staff conducted classes and supervised drill periods. Replacing Major Crowley as P.M.S., Captain Mason Shelton, assisted by the Staff, has carried out a similar program of instruction and training. This program has been successful in increasing the knowledge, proficiency, discipline, and Esprit de Corps of the Battle Group, shown by the performance during the annual Federal Inspection in March. In addition to their duties as instructors, members of the Military Staff supervise the Gold Star Drill Platoon and the Rifle Team and conduct thorough inspections of the dormitories and cadets.

The Cadet Staff is the executive unit of the Cadet Corps. These officers are responsible for command, intelligence, training, administrative, and supply operations. The Staff also grades parades and drill performances and at the end of each month and year calculates the total points to determine the Efficiency Company.

The Battle Group Commander, the senior officer in the Cadet Corps, is in charge of all phases of cadet life stemming from the Commandant's Office and Military Department and is responsible for executing the orders of the Commandant and P.M.S. The Battle Group Executive Officer is the assistant to the Commander; the S-1, or Adjutant, is responsible for all formations and assists in the administrative details of the Commandant's Office; the S-2 is the Public Relations Officer; the S-3 is the Training and Operations Officer; the Supply and Maintenance Officer is the S-4; the position of Sergeant Major was recently created to aid in the administrative details of the Battle Group. Assistants to some primary Staff officers were added too late in the year to be pictured.




GOLD STAR




VARSITY TRACK






