
He enjoys bicycling, light opera, suspense filled mystery novels, television and eating, for he is a fantastic gourmet cook!


He was born in Elizabeth, New Jersey, and attended high school in West Point, Connecticut.

All of the staff was out on assignments so we couldn't get a picture. Luckily, the National Honor Society filled in for us. Thanks Major


